The government will not give up on the pension reform, assures Olivier Véran. The spokesperson for the executive is optimistic before the vote on the text on Thursday. "We have the conditions so that we don't lack votes" he assures. Olivier Véran is betting on the last days before the vote to convince the undecided MPs. As for article 49.3 to force the text through, the hypothesis does not seem to be on the table at the moment.

Meanwhile, the protest against the text continues. Before a new day of mobilization on Wednesday, the Parisian garbage collectors remain on strike. The sidewalks of Paris are becoming more and more obstructed with waste. According to the town hall, yesterday in total, more than 5,000 tons of waste were not collected. It has been more than a week since the garbage collectors began their movement.

A charred body was found in Marseille in the trunk of a burning car. The identity of the victim has not yet been verified. The body was found in the 14th arrondissement, in the projects named Busserine, known for drug trafficking. Last year in Marseille, around thirty people were killed in relation to drug trafficking.

And two people have died in a fire in Chalon-sur-Saône. The fire broke out in a house last night. A brother and a sister aged 70 and 74, were taken care of seriously intoxicated but they did not survive. This morning, the first expert assessments were carried out on site to try to understand the causes of this disaster.

And concern continues to grow regarding the drought. According to the Bureau of Geological and Mining Research, all of the French groundwater shows levels below normal. The situation has deteriorated in recent weeks due to the absence of effective precipitation last month. 80% of levels are moderately low, even very low. The Research Office speaks of great uncertainty for the coming months.
